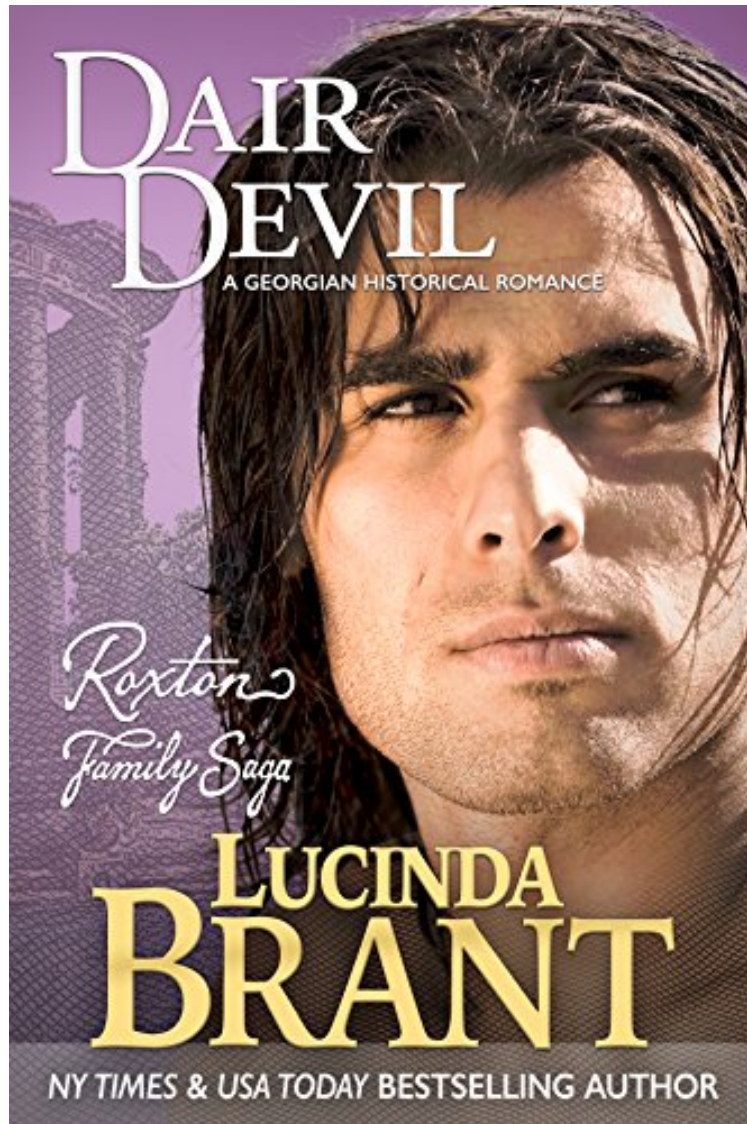

several times I embarked on a search for something I would enjoy just as much. Not easy. I found myself thoroughly irritated by stories purported to be by the new Heyer but full of modern swear words and thoroughly modern attitudes. Contemporary swearing does not sit well in a Georgian or Regency context. Then I found a free offer book by Lucinda Brant and decided I had nothing to lose by giving it a try, fully prepared to fling it aside if I came across too much modern phraseology and unlikely attitudes. Well, after a few chapters of looking for annoyances I found myself caught by an interesting plot and believable characters, settings, language and historical detail. I began to hope. Brant's books are set in the Georgian period and maintain a fine balance of appropriate language and attitude that is believable yet appealing to the modern reader. *Dair Devil* is really enjoyable as a stand-alone, but for full enjoyment begin with Book 1, *Noble Satyr*. That's followed by Book 2, *Midnight Marriage*, Book 3 *Autumn Duchess*, and now Book 4 *Dair Devil*. In this latest story we meet most of the characters from the previous books and it's interesting to see what has happened to them since their first appearance. (Let me add that this isn't a prerequisite for the enjoyment of *Dair Devil* though.) Alisdair, hero of *Dair Devil*, doesn't seem a promising hero at first but becomes ever more interesting as the layers of his character and the events that formed it become known. The heroine Rory is just as multi-faceted and represents an interesting theme in the story i.e. how does society view people with a physical disability? The plot is fairly complex with some interesting twists; I lost a lot of sleep because I couldn't put it down. The characters are satisfyingly rounded, you feel that you really know them as people. So to sum up a wonderful sense of period, beautifully descriptive writing and truly human characters. There's also loads of Brant's research online. For anyone with a real interest in the period it's fascinating to see all the paintings, statues, stately homes, fashion, personal items, conveyances etc. that inform Brant's writing. If you haven't read anything by Lucinda Brant yet, jump right in. I can't wait for the next book, these are definitely the read again stories I was looking for!
