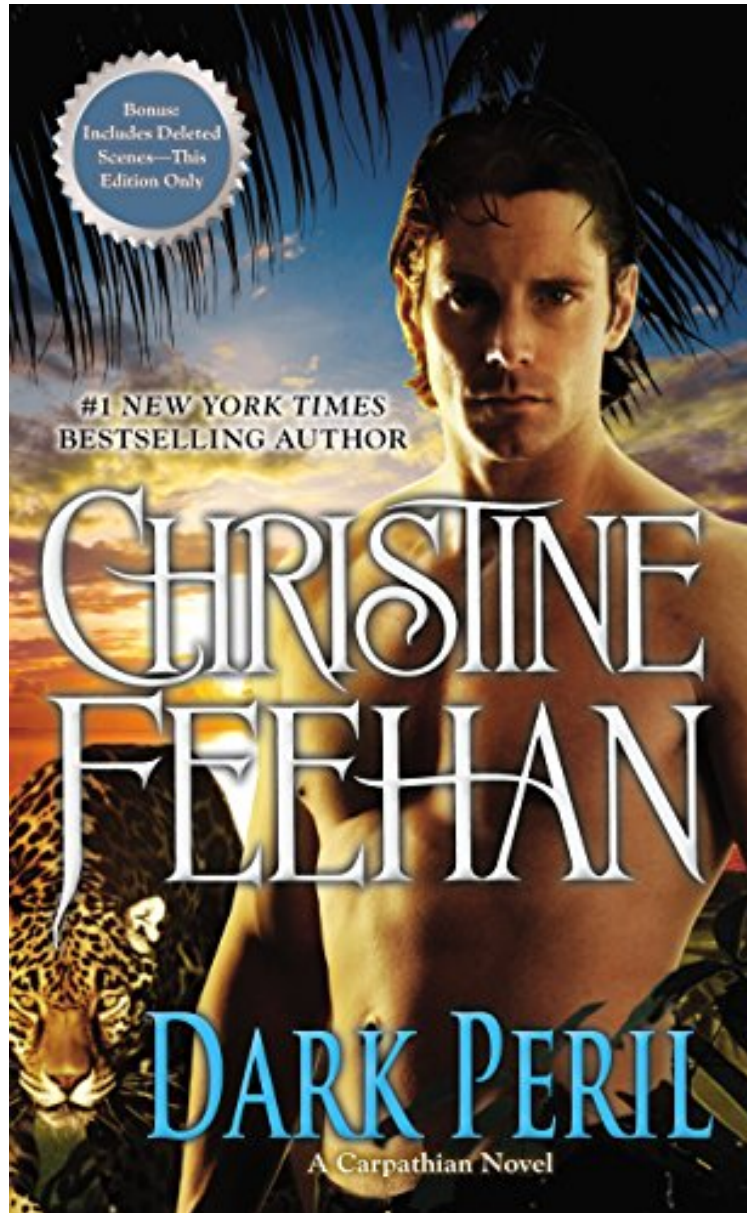

The author can do better Von Catalus I am giving one star for a nice male lead, who is a proper hero to fall in love with instead of a jerk. I am giving a second star for a really cool heroine. A third star for making me believe in the attraction between the two of them and a fourth star for letting me know the fate of the protagonists from the other series. I am subtracting a star for the story. Admittedly the book HAS a story and it might have been a good one, but unfortunately the author spends so much time to bore us with endless fight scenes, interrupted by the occasional sex scene that she doesn't have time to actually tell the story in question - except in the most cursory fashion. It makes the book almost unreadable, because it just isn't interesting. I am subtracting a second star for the magic. A lot of these fight scenes are made up with magic battles. If the author insists in boring us to death with those and including all those tedious chants in excruciating detail one would think she has a clear magic system in place for her world. Despite the fact that this is hardly the first time I've had to read more about the magic of the Carpathian world than I wanted to, I am still as clueless about the rules behind it as I was in the first book of the series. Either she doesn't have any reasonable system at all or she's incapable of explaining it. That leaves two stars, which is fair because on the one hand I feel as if I've wasted my time reading this, on the other hand I've read worse.
